

Initial Investigation

On September 26, 2025, Pleasanton Police Department ("PPD") Officer Faure was dispatched to John Muir Health Pleasanton Outpatient Center ("John Muir") located at 5860 Owens Drive, to investigate criminal threats. Specifically, Respondent's doctor (Reporting Party) relayed that Respondent had threatened to "shoot [the hospital] up," thereby causing Reporting Party to fear for herself, medical staff, and patients.

Interview with Clinical Assistant

Upon arrival, Officer Faure interviewed a clinical assistant. She shared that although Respondent was scheduled for an ultrasound, he became frustrated during the process. As a result, he abruptly departed the imaging department, arriving at his doctor's suite, where the Clinical Assistant advised him to complete the test. Respondent refused; he declared "I'm fucking tired, I am going to shoot this place up." He then left the premises. A nearby colleague later corroborated the Clinical Assistant's statement.

Interview with Reporting Party

Subsequently, Officer Faure interviewed Reporting Party, who conveyed that she is Respondent's personal doctor. She relayed that Respondent suffers from a personality disorder and is not currently mentally stable. She informed that Respondent was the victim of an assault with a deadly weapon in July. Since the incident, Respondent has been hostile towards law enforcement and towards the other party ("Other Party").

A few days ago, on September 23, 2025, Respondent told Reporting Party that he was going to enact "revenge" against the Other Party by "shooting him and his family," adding that he was not concerned about going to "jail for the rest of [his] life."


With this recent threat in mind, Reporting Party was terrified when she was notified of Respondent's threat to "shoot the hospital up." Indeed, she was in direct fear for herself and her patients. (Continued...)

Subsequent Investigation

On September 29, 2025, I was assigned to conduct a follow-up investigation. I ascertained that Respondent had previously surrendered an unregistered weapon to law enforcement as a result of the July incident. Based on his criminal threats, and his likely access to weapons, I authored a Gun Violence Emergency Protective Order ("GVEPO"); it was subsequently approved by the Honorable Thomas Rasch. Additionally, Detective Furphy authored a search warrant for Respondent's residence, which was approved by Honorable Judge Thomas Nixon.

Interview with Respondent

Prior officers had attempted to interview Respondent to no avail. On this day, however, Detective Jewell reached Respondent, who later arrived to the police station.

Preliminarily, Respondent admitted that he became frustrated and left during the ultrasound process. However, he categorically denied threatening to shoot up the office. He further stated that he did not own any firearms, other than the one surrendered in July.

Moreover, Respondent consented to a weapons search, which revealed two unregistered firearms, one magazine, and various ammunition, despite Respondent's assurances to the contrary. All items were collected and booked into the PPD Property Room for safekeeping. For a full description of weapons and ammunition seized during the search, please see Property Report to PPD case number 25-03166.

Based on the investigation and my assessment of the parties' credibility, I concluded that Respondent not only threatened to commit a mass shooting at John Muir, but also had the capability to execute the threat. Thus, I determined that he was in direct violation of Penal Code §422. I thereby forwarded the case to the District Attorney's Office.


Respondent is Unfit to Possess Firearms

Respondent made threats to commit a mass shooting, while in possession of multiple unregistered firearms and ammunition. Coupled with his reported mental instability and personality disorder, he poses a risk to himself and others. Thus, he is unfit to possess firearms.

Body worn camera was activated throughout the incident.

Notification:

On 9/26/25 at approximately 1125 hours Mark Webster DOB 7/25/54 CA DL #N0634619 was at a doctors appointment at John Muir Health located at 5860 Owens Drive. Mark met with an ultrasound technician to conduct an ultrasound. During the course of the ultrasound, Mark became very upset and frustrated. Mark left the imagining area of the doctor's office and went back to meet with his doctor.

Statement of [REDACTED]

Mark met with clinical assistant [REDACTED] and informed her of his frustrations [REDACTED] met with other medical staff to consult about Mark. They informed [REDACTED] to tell Mark he needed to go back to the imagining department to get his ultrasound done. Mark stated the following: "Im fucking tired, I am going to shoot this place up".

After that was said, [REDACTED] stated she felt in fear for her safety and the safety of anyone on the premise. Mark left the doctors office after making the statements.

Statement of Dr [REDACTED]

Doctor [REDACTED] contacted the Pleasanton Police Department and stated the following in summary. [REDACTED] is Mark's personal doctor and she has met with him several times over the past couple months.

When she was informed of the threats Mark stated today (9/26/25) by her medical team, she was in fear for herself and patients. [REDACTED] is aware of Mark's violent past and claims he is not mentally stable at this time (personality disorder). Mark was involved in an assault with a deadly weapon as a victim in July of 2025 with a [REDACTED] Since that incident he has made threats towards [REDACTED] and has been hostile towards law enforcement.

[REDACTED] informed me when she met with Mark on 9/23/25 for a doctors appointment Mark told her the following: " I don't care, whatever happens. I am going to take revenge and I am going to shoot him and shoot his family. I don't care if I have to go to jail for it for the rest of my life." [REDACTED] informed me this statement was directed towards [REDACTED]

NOTIFICATION:

On 09/16/25, I was working as a Detective for the Pleasanton Police Department's Criminal Investigations Unit, and I was assigned to assist with a criminal threats case.

NARRATIVE:

I authored a search warrant for the premises at 3683 Vineyard Ave. Pleasanton, CA 94566 pursuant to EPO-002 (Gun Violence Emergency Protective Order), which authorizes a search warrant to be obtained for the purpose of seizing firearms and ammunition from a person under a GVRO. Items to be seized included all firearms (guns), firearm parts (receivers, frames, and any item that may be used as or easily turned into a receiver or frame), ammunition, or magazines. The search warrant was signed and approved on 09/29/25 at 1619 hours by Honorable Judge Thomas Nixon.

At the time, Mark Webster was at the station providing a statement and gave consent to search his residence for firearms.

On 09/29/25 at approximately 1624 hours, CIU Detectives served the search warrant at 3683 Vineyard Ave. Pleasanton, CA 94566. The following items were seized pursuant to the GVRO (EPO-002):

1. Raven Arms, Mp-25, 0.25 caliber, Ser: 1059883 located in a nightstand (right of bed) in the main bedroom

NARRATIVE:

On 9/29/25, I was on duty working as a Pleasanton PD Criminal Investigations Unit (CIU) detective when I was assigned to conduct follow up for this criminal threats case. I reviewed Officer Faure's initial report and noted the alleged threat was made to John Muir Health employee [REDACTED] [REDACTED]

During a verbal altercation, Webster allegedly stated, "I'm fucking tired, I am going to shoot this place up." [REDACTED] was reportedly in fear for her safety after Webster's threat.

It should be noted there had been a prior incident in 2025 involving Webster in which a firearm was seized from his possession. Its should be noted the firearm seized during that incident as not registered to Webster but was in his possession at his residence. Based on Webster's statement and knowledge he had recently possessed a firearm, I believed it was necessary to ensure Webster was not in possession of any firearms to ensure the victim's safety.

I made contact with the Honorable Judge Tom Rasch of the Alameda County Superior Court and explained the circumstances surrounding this case. Rasch approved a Gun Violence Emergency Protective Order (GVRO), ordering Webster to relinquish any and all firearms and ammunition in his possession to law enforcement. I completed the necessary paperwork for the GVRO.

After the GVRO was issued by Rasch, Webster needed to be served with the order before the order could be filed with the courts. I also needed to speak with Webster in regards to the incident that occurred on 9/26/25. Detective Jewell contacted Webster via telephone who elected to come to the police station voluntarily to talk about the incident.

When he arrived at the police station, Detective Jewell escorted Webster into an interview room where I spoke with Webster. Our conversation was recorded by my department issued Axon body worn camera. The recording was later uploaded to evidence.com.

Its should be noted the door to the interview room was left open and there were no obstructions preventing Webster, who was sitting closest to the door, from voluntarily leaving the room on his own accord.

I told Webster I was investigating the allegation of criminal threats Webster made on 9/26/25. I provided Webster a Beheler Admonishment, stating he was not under arrest and was free to leave at any time. Webster elected to provide a statement that is summarized below.

STATEMENT OF MARK WEBSTER:

Webster arrived at John Muir to make an appointment for an ultrasound he needed. He checked in using the office's kiosk and waited for his name to be called. When a female employee [REDACTED] called his name, he approached the employee and provided the employee with his paperwork to make an appointment. Webster explained the employee was wearing a mask while behind a plexiglass partition, which made it difficult for him to hear the employee's voice.

As the employee was speaking, Webster told the employee multiple times he was unable to hear what she was saying due to the mask she was wearing. After the fourth time Webster told the employee he could not hear, he asked for his paperwork back. Webster proceeded to go to the second floor of the medical office where he told other employees, "I'm not coming back. I'm not coming back, tell Doctor [REDACTED] I'm not gonna go through this procedure and I'm not coming back and I'm gonna find myself a new doctor."

When asked if he ever stated what was reported by [REDACTED] Webster stated, "No, I don't even have a gun, I only have one shotgun (referring to the shotgun seized by PPD during the previous incident), but no. I never said anything like that." Webster advised the medical office should have surveillance recordings showing the interaction. Webster stated he did not know why anyone would report any threats by him. During our conversation, Webster admitted he was angry because he was unable to make the appointment he needed to make, but repeatedly denied threatening anyone at John Muir that day. Webster also said he did not say anything that could have been perceived as a threat.

INVESTIGATION CONTINUED:

After obtaining the statement from Webster, I explained the GVRO. He advised he did not have any firearms and that PPD was in possession of his only firearm. Webster ultimately provided consent for officers to search his residence to seize any firearms or ammunition pursuant to the GVRO. As I stood by with Webster while other PPD personnel responded to his residence, he advised he may have ammunition in the home (shotgun shells and snake shot). I ultimately served Webster with the GVRO and provided him with a copy of the order. It should be noted prior to Webster providing consent to search his property, Detective Furphy authored a search warrant pursuant to the GVRO to seize firearms and ammunition. Webster was also provided a copy of the search warrant.

After I completed my interview with Webster and he had been served with the GVRO, he eventually elected to leave the police station. During a search of Webster's residence, two firearms (handgun and a pellet rifle) were seized pursuant to the GVRO. The items collected were later booked into the PPD evidence locker for safekeeping.

On 9/30/25, I made contact with [REDACTED] to clarify her involvement with the incident. [REDACTED] advised she was not present at the time Webster made the alleged threats reported by [REDACTED] [REDACTED] confirmed at no time did Webster threaten her in any way.

John Muir Health's security director [REDACTED] advised there are no surveillance cameras on the property where the incident between [REDACTED] and Webster occurred. He also advised another employee, [REDACTED] [REDACTED] may have been present when Webster made the threats to [REDACTED] I made contact with [REDACTED] via telephone who provided a statement that is summarized below. It should be noted the threat was not directed at [REDACTED] but she witnessed the incident.

█████ was working alongside ██████ while ██████ was speaking to Webster. ██████ was also assisting another customer for part of the incident so did not hear everything that Webster said during the altercation. ██████ heard Webster say something similar to, "Cancel my appointment," before leaving the medical office. ██████ heard Webster say, "Shoot up," as he was leaving. She stated due to Webster's behavior, she was in fear for her safety, even though the words were not spoken towards her. I asked ██████ if there was anyone else working with she and ██████ and she advised they were the only two working the appointment counter at the time of the incident.

CONCLUSION:

Based on the statements obtained, including ██████ stating she was in fear for her safety after hearing Webster's alleged threat, Webster was in violation of PC 422(a), which states:

Any person who willfully threatens to commit a crime which will result in death or great bodily injury to another person, with the specific intent that the statement, made verbally, in writing, or by means of an electronic communication device, is to be taken as a threat, even if there is no intent of actually carrying it out, which, on its face and under the circumstances in which it is made, is so unequivocal, unconditional, immediate, and specific as to convey to the person threatened, a gravity of purpose and an immediate prospect of execution of the threat, and thereby causes that person reasonably to be in sustained fear for his or her own safety or for his or her immediate family's safety, shall be punished by imprisonment in the county jail not to exceed one year, or by imprisonment in the state prison.

I am forwarding this case to the Alameda County District Attorney's Office for review.

You are required to surrender all firearms, ammunition, and magazines that you own or possess in accordance with section 18120 of the Penal Code and you may not have in your custody or control, own, purchase, possess, or receive, or attempt to purchase or receive, any firearm, ammunition, or magazines while this order is in effect. A hearing will be held on the date and at the time noted on Page 1 to determine if a more permanent gun violence restraining order should be issued. Failure to appear at the hearing may result in a court making an order against you that is valid for a period between one and five years. You may seek the advice of an attorney as to any matter connected with the order. The attorney should be consulted promptly so that the attorney may assist you in any matter connected with the order.

Violation of this Order is a misdemeanor. - Complete a proof of personal service and file it with the court. You may use form GV-200 for this purpose.
- Within one business day of service, submit the proof of service directly into the California Restraining and Protective Order System (CARPOS), including the serving officer's name and law enforcement agency.

Duties of Agency on Surrender of Firearms, Firearm Parts, Ammunition, or Magazines

The law enforcement agency that has received the surrendered prohibited items listed in item 6b, above, must do the following:

- Retain the prohibited items until the termination or expiration of this Order or of any other gun violence restraining order issued by the court.

- If someone other than the respondent claims title to any of the prohibited items surrendered, determine whether that person is the lawful owner. If so, return the prohibited items to that person as provided by chapter 2 of division 11 of title 4 of the Penal Code (commencing with section 33850).

Enforcing This Order



- c. You must surrender (turn in, sell, or store) all prohibited items in your custody or control or that you possess or own. If a law enforcement officer asks you to turn over your prohibited items, you must do so immediately. If no request is made by a law enforcement officer, you must surrender all prohibited items within 24 hours of being served with this Order. You may surrender these items by turning them in to law enforcement, selling them to a licensed gun dealer, or storing them with a licensed gun dealer for as long as this Order or any more permanent order granted at the hearing in item ③ is in effect.
- d. Within 48 hours of receiving this Order, you must file a receipt with the court that proves that all your prohibited items have been turned in, sold, or stored. (You may use *Receipt for Firearms, Firearm Parts, Ammunition, and Magazines* (form GV-800) for the receipt.) You must also file a copy of the receipt with the law enforcement agency that served you with this order. **FAILURE TO FILE THIS RECEIPT IS A VIOLATION OF THIS ORDER.**

Warnings and Notices to the Respondent

To the restrained person: This Order is valid until the expiration date and time noted on page 1. You are required to surrender all firearms, ammunition, and magazines that you own or possess in accordance with section 18120 of the Penal Code and you may not have in your custody or control, own, purchase, possess, or receive, or attempt to purchase or receive, any firearm, ammunition, or magazines while this order is in effect. A hearing will be held on the date and at the time noted on Page 1 to determine if a more permanent gun violence restraining order should be issued. Failure to appear at the hearing may result in a court making an order against you that is valid for a period between one and five years. You may seek the advice of an attorney as to any matter connected with the order. The attorney should be consulted promptly so that the attorney may assist you in any matter connected with the order.

Violation of this Order is a misdemeanor. If you violate this Order, you will be prohibited from having in your custody or control, owning, purchasing, possessing, or receiving, or attempting to purchase or receive, any prohibited items listed in item 6b, above, for a period of five years. This Order must be enforced by any law enforcement officer in the state of California who is aware of or shown a copy of this Order. The Order remains enforceable regardless of the acts of the parties; it may be changed only by an order of the court.

After You Have Been Served With a Temporary Order

- Obey the order by turning in all firearms (guns), firearm parts, ammunition, and magazines to a law enforcement agency or selling them to or storing them with a licensed gun dealer.
- Read *How Can I Respond to a Petition for Gun Violence Restraining Order?* (form [GV-120-INFO](#)) to learn how to respond to this Order.
- If you do not oppose the petition, fill out *Consent to Gun Violence Restraining Order and Surrender of Firearms* (form [GV-125](#)) and file it with the court clerk.
- If you disagree with the petition, fill out *Response to Petition for Gun Violence Restraining Order* (form [GV-120](#)) and file it with the court clerk.
- You must have form GV-120 served by mail on the Petitioner or the Petitioner's attorney. You cannot do this yourself. The person who does the mailing should complete and sign *Proof of Service by Mail* (form [GV-250](#)). File the completed proof of service with the court clerk before the hearing date or bring it with you to the hearing.
- In addition to the response, you may file and have declarations served, signed by you and other persons who have personal knowledge of the facts. You may use *Declaration* (form [MC-030](#)) for this purpose. It is available from the clerk's office at the court shown on page 1 of this form or at www.courts.ca.gov/forms. If you do not know how to prepare a declaration, you should see a lawyer.
- Whether or not you file a response, you should attend the hearing. If you have any witnesses, they must also attend the hearing. You and your witnesses may attend the hearing remotely (check with your court for instructions).
- At the hearing, the judge can make a gun violence restraining order against you that lasts between one to five years. Tell the judge why you disagree with the order requested.

Instructions for Law Enforcement

Duties of Officer Serving This Order

The officer who serves this order on the restrained person must do the following:

- Ask if the restrained person is in possession of any of the prohibited items listed in item 6b, above, or has custody or control of any that they have not already turned in.
- Order the restrained person to immediately surrender to you all prohibited items.
- Issue a receipt to the restrained person for all prohibited items that have been surrendered.
- Complete a proof of personal service and file it with the court. You may use form GV-200 for this purpose.
- Within one business day of service, submit the proof of service directly into the California Restraining and Protective Order System (CARPOS), including the serving officer's name and law enforcement agency.

Duties of Agency on Surrender of Firearms, Firearm Parts, Ammunition, or Magazines

The law enforcement agency that has received the surrendered prohibited items listed in item 6b, above, must do the following:

- Retain the prohibited items until the termination or expiration of this Order or of any other gun violence restraining order issued by the court.
- On the expiration of this Order or of any later gun violence restraining order issued by the court, return the prohibited items to the respondent as provided by chapter 2 of division 11 of title 4 of the Penal Code (commencing with section 33850). Section 34000 provides for the sale or destruction of any unclaimed items.
- If someone other than the respondent claims title to any of the prohibited items surrendered, determine whether that person is the lawful owner. If so, return the prohibited items to that person as provided by chapter 2 of division 11 of title 4 of the Penal Code (commencing with section 33850).

Enforcing This Order

The law enforcement officer should determine if the respondent had notice of the order. Consider the respondent "served" (given notice) if:

- The officer sees a copy of the proof of service or confirms that the proof of service is on file; or
- The respondent was informed of the order by an officer; or
- The officer sees a filed copy of form GV-125.

An officer can obtain information about the contents of the order and proof of service in CARPOS. If proof of service on the respondent cannot be verified, the agency must advise the restrained person of the terms of the order and then enforce it (*see above: Duties of Officer Serving This Order*).

The provisions in this *Temporary Gun Violence Restraining Order* do not affect those of any other protective or restraining order in effect, including a criminal protective order. The provisions in any other another existing protective order remain in effect.

To the Petitioner in 1:

- The court cannot make an order at the court hearing unless the respondent has been personally given (served) a copy of the Petition and a temporary order if issued. To show that the respondent has been served, the person who served the forms must fill out a proof of service form. *Proof of Personal Service* (form GV-200) may be used.

This includes firearm receivers and frames, and any item that may be used as or easily turned into a receiver or frame (see Penal Code section 16531). If issued, the order will last for one year. If an order is granted, you will also be prohibited from owning, possessing, or buying body armor and will have to relinquish any body armor you have.
- If you do not oppose the petition and are willing to give up your firearm rights, complete and file a *Consent to Gun Violence Restraining Order and Surrender of Firearms* (form GV-125).
- If you are unable to attend your court hearing or need more time to prepare your case, you may ask to reschedule your court date. Use *Request to Continue Court Hearing for Gun Violence Restraining Order* (form GV-115).
